Some of her favorite roles she has played include Margot (Anne Frank), Laurie (Brighton Beach Memoirs), Francis (Five Women Wearing the Same Dress), Smitty (Play On!), Jamie (Fruitcakes), Wicked Witch (The Wonderful Wizard of Oz), Mad Hatter (The Mad Tea Party), Violet Beauregard (Charlie and the Chocolate Factory), Chip (Beauty and the Beast) and

Casting Director (Bad Auditions by Bad Actors). When not performing on stage, you might have seen Haiden working at the box office, running sound and lights, or stage managing a show! She loved stage managing "A Streetcar Named Desire," as well as assisting for "The Great Gatsby" and "Bright Star." Haiden has been nominated for an AriZoni and 2 NYA's. She also toured with the Cre8ive Theatre Troupe to several different schools including GCU and graduated from Childsplay Conservatory. Haiden truly loves the arts, and hopes you enjoy the show!

About the Playwright- Henrik Ibsen

Henrik Ibsen was born on March 20, 1828, in Skien, Norway. In 1862, he was exiled to Italy, where he wrote the tragedy Brand. In 1868, Ibsen moved to Germany, where he wrote one of his most famous works: the play A Doll's House. ...
He died on May 23, 1906, in Oslo, Norway.



Fun Facts about Henrik Ibsen's A Doll's House

A Doll's House was influenced by the mental breakdown of Ibsen's friend.

Ibsen's friend Laura Kieler borrowed money to take her tubercular husband to a southern mild climate for his health. She ended up forging a signature to get the money. When the forgery was discovered, her husband divorced her and her children were taken from her. She subsequently had a nervous breakdown and spent time in a mental hospital. Many of these events formed the plot structure of *A Doll's House*.

Early reviewers didn't know what to make of Ibsen's play.

One reviewer stated, "one leaves with a despondent feeling of ... what is hollow and disappointing in much of so-called human happiness, but—without any of the joy." Another complained, "I ask openly: is there a mother ... who would leave husband and children and home so she herself first and foremost can become 'a human being'? And I answer most decidedly: No, absolutely not!" But *The Social Democrat* raved, "Go and see this play, you mighty supporters and defenders of morality."

A group of early Chinese feminists were known as "Chinese Noras."

Chinese playwrights and audiences were strongly affected by Ibsen and in particular by *A Doll's House*. "Ibsenism," another term for individualism, encouraged modernization and led Chinese women to discuss independence from their families, avoidance of arranged marriages, and the necessity of financial security. Mao Zedong's wife Jiang Qing was a "Chinese Nora"—and even played Nora onstage before she married Mao.

About Louisa May Alcott and her book "Little Women"

Louisa May Alcott (November 29, 1832 – March 6, 1888) was an American novelist, short story writer and poet best known as the author of the novel *Little Women* (1868) and its sequels *Little Men* (1871) and *Jo's*



Boys (1886). Raised in New England by

her transcendentalist parents, Abigail May and Amos Bronson Alcott, she grew up among many of the well-known intellectuals of the day, such as Ralph Waldo Emerson, Nathaniel Hawthorne, Henry David Thoreau, and Henry Wadsworth Longfellow. Alcott's family suffered from financial difficulties, and while she worked to help support the family from an early age, she also sought an outlet in writing. She began to receive critical success for her writing in the 1860s. Early in her career, she sometimes used pen names such as A. M. Barnard, under which she wrote lurid short stories and sensation novels for adults that focused on passion and revenge.

Published in 1868, *Little Women* is set in the Alcott family home, Orchard House, in Concord, Massachusetts, and is loosely based on Alcott's childhood experiences with her three sisters, Abigail May Alcott Nieriker, Elizabeth Sewall Alcott, and Anna Alcott Pratt. The novel was well-received at the time and is still popular today among both children and adults. It has been adapted many times to the stage, film, and television. Alcott was an abolitionist and a feminist and remained unmarried throughout her life. All her life she was active in such reform movements as temperance and women's suffrage. She died from a stroke, two days after her father died, in Boston on March 6, 1888.

Did you know?

IN THE 1980S, A JAPANESE ANIME VERSION OF *LITTLE WOMEN* WAS RELEASED.

In 1987, Japan made an anime version of *Little Women* that ran for 48 half-hour episodes.
